Rules of final examination or credit

- The final examination consists of two parts: practical and theoretical. Practical part refers to “Paediatrics” and “Paediatric surgery” only. Once the practical part is passed students are allowed to proceed to the theoretical exam. Practical part result is 30% of the result for each subject.
- The examination on “Specificity of Paediatric Pharmacotherapy” is held right after the course.
- For three remaining subjects theoretical test examination is held twice per academic year: after winter and summer semesters, during examination sessions. The exam has a form of a multiple-choice test consisting of 120 questions (modelled on LEK test questions) and contain:
 - “Paediatrics” - 80 questions,
 - “Developmental Psychiatry” - 12 questions,
 - “Paediatric Surgery” - 23 questions.
- Results for each subject are calculated separately. Minimum threshold for passing the written part is 60%.
- The results together form the final score as given below. In case of “Paediatrics” and “Paediatric Surgery” the result of theoretical part makes 70% of the result for each subject.

Criteria of final practical examination or credit

- Practical examination is described in the syllabi for “Paediatrics” and “Paediatric Surgery”
- The result is included in final grade with a weight of 0.3 (30%) for “Paediatrics”.

Criteria for passing the final examination or obtaining credit for the course or module

- Conditions for obtaining a positive assessment are:
 - completing the “Practical skills chart”,
 - passing the practical part of the clinical subjects,
 - passing the theoretical part during the final exam (refers to “Paediatrics”, “Developmental Psychiatry” and “Paediatric Surgery”) or separate exam on “Specificity of Paediatric Pharmacotherapy”.
- The final module grade is combined of partitive subject grades weighted according to ECTS of each subject:

- The final result is then converted into a grade according to the scale:

Result	Grade
92% or more	very good (5)
88% to < 92%	good+ (4+)
80% to < 88%	good (4)
71% to < 80%	satisfactory+ (3+)
60% to < 71%	satisfactory (3)
less than 60%	failed (2)

- A Student who has not passed the examination is entitled to take one retake on the failed subject(s). In case of a small number of participants, the theoretical part of a retake has oral form, otherwise it is identical to the first attempt. The decision on the form of a retake is taken by the Teaching Coordinator of the Unit. The final grade for the retake is calculated similarly as for the first attempt.
