<b>Rules of final examination or credit</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The final credit has a form of colloquium and is conducted on the last day of the module.</li><li>• During the colloquium a student is asked 4 open questions concerning skills and knowledge described in syllabus or related to the topics presented by students during the module.</li></ul>	
<b>Criteria of final practical examination or credit</b>	

**Criteria for passing the final examination or obtaining credit for the course or module**

- Conditions for obtaining a positive assessment are:
  - completing credits in the “Practical skills chart”,
  - demonstrating the acquisition of social competences defined by the syllabus,
  - preparing an essay / case report / presentation (the topics are assigned to students on the first days of classes in the unit),
  - passing the colloquium.
- In a colloquium each answer is scored from 0 to 3 points (total 12 points). A Student has to obtain a positive score (non-zero) for every answer. The final grade is assigned acc. to the following scale:

Score obtained	Number of points	Grade
88% or more	11 – 12	very good (5)
71% to 87%	9 – 10	good (4)
60% to 70%	7 – 8	satisfactory (3)
less than 60% Or any zero-scored answer	<7	failed (2)

- A student can take up to two retakes of a colloquium on any date agreed with the examiner.

**Detailed OHS rules applicable during classes taught at the Faculty unit**

- Students are obliged to wear protective clothing (clean coats, shoes) and have required medical equipment: a stethoscope, a torch, a measuring tape (at least one for each subgroup).
- Bringing food or drinks to wards, clinics or labs is forbidden.
