Rules of final examination or credit

- The final credit has a form of colloquium and is conducted on the last day of the module.
- During the colloquium a student is asked 4 open questions concerning skills and knowledge described in syllabus or related to the topics presented by students during the module.

Criteria of final practical examination or credit

Criteria for passing the final examination or obtaining credit for the course or module

- Conditions for obtaining a positive assessment are:
 - completing credits in the "Practical skills chart",
 - demonstrating the acquisition of social competences defined by the syllabus,
 - preparing an essay / case report / presentation (the topics are assigned to students on the first days of classes in the unit),
 - passing the colloquium.
- In a colloquium each answer is scored from 0 to 3 points (total 12 points). A Student has to obtain a positive score (non-zero) for every answer. The final grade is assigned acc. to the following scale:

Score obtained	Number of points	Grade
88% or more	11 – 12	very good (5)
71% to 87%	9 – 10	good (4)
60% to 70%	7 – 8	satisfactory (3)
less than 60% Or any zero-scored answer	<7	failed (2)

• A student can take up to two retakes of a colloquium on any date agreed with the examiner.

Detailed OHS rules applicable during classes taught at the Faculty unit
